COMMISSIONERS' COURT MINUTES FOR AUGUST 11TH, 2025

BE IT REMEMBERED on the 11th day of August 2025, the Commissioners' Court of Lipscomb County, Texas convened for their regular session at 09:00 A.M. at the regular meeting place of the court at the courthouse in Lipscomb, Texas opening the meeting with the pledge of allegiance and invocation given by, the Honorable Dori Roots, County Judge with the following members present:

Honorable Dori Roots, County Judge; Juan Cantu, Commissioner of Precinct #1; Brandon Meier Commissioner of Precinct #2; Scotty Schilling, Commissioner of Precinct #3; Dan Cockrell, Commissioner of Precinct #4; Kimberly Long, County Treasurer, Chrissy Dunn, County Clerk.

Also present: Nancy Shepherd, Justice of the Peace, Ben Eggleston, Sheriff, J.R. Sprague, Rachel Swarzenbach Executive Director of the Wolf Creek Heritage Museum, Khasi Campos and Becky Blair with PRPC, John Merriss, with Doishier, Pickens & Frances LLC, Clint Allred & Sheri Rice with Security Insurance.

CONSIDERATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING:

HEAR FROM RACHEL SWARZENBACH EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WOLF CREEK HERITAGE MUSEUM:

Rachel reported that from January to July, the museum welcomed approximately 1,400 visitors, and walk-in traffic continues to increase. The museum's weekly Tuesday children's activities draw 8–12 kids and about five parents, while monthly events include Bingo on the third Saturday with (20–40 attendees) and an adult classes with (10–15 attendees).

This summer, the museum expanded its children's programs, offering Lego Building Day, Water Day, a Fairy Garden Day, and a July camp for ages 6–12 with 10 participants.

Facility updates include repairs to the museum's windmill, which will be displayed indoors for preservation, and restoration of the train table by a hobbyist, enabling easier future maintenance. The research room—home to extensive paper history on Lipscomb County—is being reorganized. The museum is also upgrading its internet service through PTCI to provide Wi-Fi throughout the building.

A September celebration is planned, featuring a morning 5K and 1-mile walk, games and activities, open tours of the school and museum, cowboy poetry by J.W. Beesome, live music from 6:00–10:00 p.m., and a gospel performance by Casey McKanna on Sunday, September 14. The event will celebrate all things Lipscomb County, and a fundraiser selling bottled water and cookies will support museum activities.

ACCEPT THE LIPSCOMB COUNTY AUDIT REPORT PRESENTED BY THE COUNTY AUDITOR JOHN MERRISS WITH DOSSIER, PICKENS & FRANCES LLC:

John Merriss presented the Independent Auditor's Report to the Commissioners Court, noting that, year over year, Lipscomb County has maintained a conservative budget. For the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, the County's net position is \$12,929,392—an increase of \$1,155,198 from the previous year. Merriss stated that the County is in very good financial condition and in a strong position. He also advised the court that there will be a 5% price increase for the cost of the annual audit for next year.

Clint Allred from Security Insurance presented renewal quotes for the County's insurance coverage. The Court agreed to renew the policy with the same deductibles as last year, removing the terrorism coverage, for a total cost of \$168,396.00—a 12% increase from the previous year.

REVIEW OF THE JUSTICE OF THE PEACE REPORTS:

The total collected by the Justice of the Peace for the month of July was, \$797.00 with \$443.10 going to county revenue.

HEAR FROM SHERIFF BEN EGGLESTON:

Sheriff Ben Eggleston provided an update on activities for the month of August. The Sheriff's Office reported several motorists assists, inmate transports, mental transports, and a reckless driver incident, along with 37 traffic stops and one assault. In Booker, eight young adults and one juvenile were involved in an incident. Following the Grand Jury's review, it was determined that the deputy involved was justified; the deputy has since returned to duty and is now Taser-certified. Sheriff Eggleston also noted that jailers will become Taser-certified upon completion of their training. The Sheriff's Office has also been handling numerous open records requests related to a pending civil lawsuit. Higgins celebrated Will Rogers Day without incident. Sheriff Eggleston reported he has also been working on his budget and reviewed the department's vehicles and mileage. Ben also reported on his Cadet Training Program, noting that Jayden Watson has been hired to begin training as a dispatcher and jailor, with the possibility of later advancing into the law enforcement program. He will work on finalizing a contract for the Cadet Program.
