CONSIDER HEALTH INSURANCE RENEWAL WITH THE TAC POOL, PRESENTED BY CLINT ALLRED, 2026-2027 PLAN YEAR:

DISCUSS ROOF LEAKS OCCURRING IN THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE, MUSEUM AND SHOW BARN:

Judge Dori Roots advised the Court that Dewitt Roofing has not yet been able to provide the County with an updated quote for repairing the leaks that 4-L Construction was previously paid to fix at the Sheriff's office, Show barn and the Museum. Judge Roots expressed hope that Sara, with the Maintenance Department, would be able to coordinate with Dewitt Roofing to come to Lipscomb and provide an updated estimate. Judge Roots also reported that a new leak has developed at the Museum and will need to be repaired. Additionally, the Court is consulting with the County Attorney to determine what options may be available for seeking reimbursement from 4-L Construction for the cost of repairing the leaks.

REPORT FROM JUDGE:

The Museum has been recognized with the 2025 Distinguished Service Award. A meet-and-greet honoring this achievement will be held on July 5, 2025.

Judge Roots reported that the Rural Ambulance Grant has been accepted. The State is working to finalize funding and move the grant process forward as quickly as possible.

The Follett Hospital Board has signed a contract with the Darrouzett Hospital Board to provide coverage for Follett EMS calls without increasing Darrouzett EMS staffing levels.

A retirement meet-and-greet honoring Norma Boughan will be held on Thursday, June 11th at 2:00 p.m.

Due to the current budget deficit, Judge Roots stated that she would not support the Appraisal District's request for a 5% salary increase.

Judge Roots also reported that there have been two confirmed cases of screwworm. Both affected animals remain alive. The cases were identified along the southern border, just north of Eagle Pass, Texas in Zavala county

The County received a letter from North Plains Electric regarding power outages and generator operations. The letter stated that if County personnel request service and no issue is found on North Plains Electric's side, a service or trip charge may be assessed. Judge Roots plans to contact Monty Eiseman to discuss the letter and the proposed trip charge. Since January, the County has experienced four power outages. Judge Roots noted that the County is current on all generator maintenance and that the generator is tested weekly.

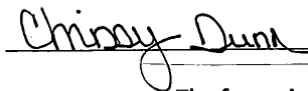
